The \$300,000 awarded, with technical assistance for this team, will aid CHEER and our coalition of partners to strengthen and create new partnerships, update our community assets and needs assessments, and continue our community-building work with residents, youth and families. Together we will build an action plan with community-based strategies to address the root causes of child poverty in the Long Branch and Takoma Park area of Montgomery County.

The ENOUGH grant will support the use of strategies identified from our previous work, including interactive listening, training, and planning sessions with members of the community leading to more meaningful participation, greater outreach to schools and government, and increased engagement with community members and potential partners creating the space to map out potential solutions to issues facing those living within the region. Our work will focus on the following four ENOUGH Result Areas: Cradle to Career Education, Healthy Families, Economic Secure Families, and Safe and Thriving Communities.
